Communities, Institutions and Enterprises towards post-humanism epistemologies and AI challenges

The event is organized with the aim to receive contributions from national and international scientific community on urban/rural dialogue within policy agendas of sustainability, transition and cohesion, according to the directions of the Green Deal and Agenda2030.

The 2024 edition of International Symposium "Networks, Markets & People" (#NMP24) aims to promote the scientific debate about the effects that the contemporary environmental, technological, social and economic global challenges produce on settlement systems, especially in Inner Areas and metropolitan cities of the Mediterranean basin.

Contemporary settlements express the distance between the built environment inertia and the "liquid" society flowing underneath. Blurred lines substituted the neat dualities such as culture-nature, urban-rural, central-marginal, affluent-deprived, enacting perpetual changes in between polarities.

The progressive increase in population raises new issues connected with resources availability and the ecological footprint of anthropic activities.

The theme of the green transition requires multidisciplinary points of view, touching on very different issues such as infrastructures and mobility systems, green buildings and energy communities, ecosystem services and land consumption.

In this scenario, a post humanist epistemology assumes that humans are dependent on the environment, and part of a larger evolving ecosystem whose agency is distributed through dynamic forces. Climate change challenges reinforced the understanding that human is entangled with its environment, encouraging in defining novel epistemologies, including, but not limited to, several disciplines: architecture, urban studies, economics, cybernetics, ecology, ethology, geography, art, psychoanalysis, sociology, anthropology and quantum physics.

The new frontier of adaptive and flexible production, supported by the ongoing digital revolution, encourages a rethinking of the concepts of proximity and interdependence within human settlements, with a paradigm shift in the center-periphery dualism. In this context, the social reproduction approach is mainly oriented at spatial justice, re-use, regeneration and environmental care.

Digital technologies and artificial intelligence bring extraordinary potential to institutions, companies and social organisations, but also carry the risk of negative impacts of unmanaged innovation.

RATIONALES

The Artificial Intelligence, challenging the labor market, has been seen lately as both the exploitation and the destruction of the human being as known until now. The progressive replacement of human workforce with machines no longer concerns the traditional industries only, affecting intellectual and creative productions.

The side effects of this transition need to be studied in order to share benefits and tradeoffs equitably between technology and service developers on the one hand, and individuals and communities on the other.

Accessibility rights to services and goods, social inclusion, commoning and sharing economies, as well as informalities and self-organization permeate the incoming social organization associated with the digital transition, towards inclusive concepts of citizenship.

Social innovation practices, collaborative governance models, open innovation frontiers, human non-human entanglements concur in setting the route for the next generation settlements, notably: the built environment, the social system and the complexity and challenges of the everyday life.

These phenomena are even more significant for marginalized areas, which are compelled to face the risk of widening the socio-economic gap with advanced regions, as happens in some territories of Mediterranean bordering countries.

Green and digital transition are the two pillars on which European policies are based for the period 2021-27, above all through the instrument of the Next Generation EU. The substantial investments planned by the EU to support the green and digital transition in the coming years require multidimensional evaluation systems, capable of supporting decision-makers in selecting the interventions most effective in pursuing the objectives, also considering that the financial resources used for the Policy implementation are borrowed from future generations, who will be held accountable for our work.



CALL FOR SESSIONS

SESSIONS Networks Markets & People offers the opportunity to organize sessions dedicated to the in-depth analysis of specific topics. Sessions may be theoretical, methodological, thematic, interdisciplinary and have broadly conceived or more narrowly focused subjects.

Session proposals must be submitted by 11:59 p.m. CST, November 13th, 2023. Please send the proposal form to nmp@unirc.it and indicate the corresponding author if there is more than one organizer. Remember, the official language of the conference is English and all submissions should be in English. The Session will be approved if it will receive at least 6 contributions.

After the manuscript reviewing process, the thematic sessions that will not maintain at least 6 contributions, will be merged according to the related topics.

Please bear in mind that each participant cannot be author, alone or with others, of more than two papers for each session. The sessions' chairs are entitled to 1 free publication and have the task of identifying two referees for each paper with the support of the Scientific Organizing Committee; they will also receive a certificate for their work.

Main topics for thematic sessions

Horizon Europe, the European framework programme for research and innovation for the 2021-27 period, consistent with SDGs, is taken as general framework for the symposium scientific debate. - Sites of Religions and Rituals


Session proposals are encouraged to target these concepts and focus on significant subjects according to the Symposium main theme. Session and paper proposals are aimed at the all experts on these issues and must observe the scientific methodology according to the Call for Sessions (#CfS24) and the Call for Papers (#CfP24).

PROCEEDINGS

VP24 PROCEEDINGS

Submitted papers will be carefully peer-reviewed by at least two experts, chosen by subject/area, and evaluated on originality, significance, technical accuracy and clarity of exposition.





Accepted papers will be published in Lecture Notes in Networks and Systems (2367-3370) by SPRINGER. LNNS volumes are indexed in the Conference Proceedings Citation Index (CPCI), part of Clarivate Analytics' Web of Science; Scopus; etc.

Where required, the publication in open access should be specifically requested and has additional costs, to be verified.

Among other publication opportunities, Authors of selected outstanding papers will be invited to submit extended versions of their papers for consideration of publication in international scientific journals, selected by the scientific board.

As the session proposals are received, they will be communicated via e-mail and through the symposium website. Follow the Symposium updates www.nmp.unirc.it.

Starting from November 14th and until December 18th 2023 it will be possible to send the papers through the procedure illustrated below.



Step 1 - Register

Authors must firstly be registered to the symposium **web-platform**. Registration:

- Click on "Account" button on the top left side of the page
- Follow the instruction to finalize the registration
- Fill in the registration form
- Please note! As last step of the registration form, specify "create account as" "Author: Able to submit items to the conference"
- Press the "Create" button at the end of the registration



Step 2 - Prepare your paper proposal

- 1 Before submitting your papers, please remember to download the Template Packet via nmp.unirc.it
- 2- At least one author for each accepted final paper must be registered.
- 3 Please remind that preliminary abstract submission is not needed.
- 4 All experimental or theoretical papers must be written in UK English and report original, previously unpublished research results.
- 5 The total length of the submitted paper should be between 6- and 10-pages including Title, abstract, figure, legends, tables and references. Papers with less than 6 pages will be automatically rejected.
- 6 Authors may submit more than one paper, multiple authors either. For each additional paper by the same author, there is a charge of $320 \in \text{per}$ additional paper. Each author can propose a maximum of 2 papers per session, and present just one paper during the symposium.
- 7- Please, make sure your paper has a ".docm" extension before submission. *For example: NMP24_MyPaper.docm*



Step 3 - Submit your paper

- 1 Click on the "STEP ONE OF THE SUBMISSION PROCESS" button to submit your paper.
- 2 Fill in the submission form. Note that abstract cannot be longer than 500 words. The upload of a word file of the paper is required to finalize your submission.
- 3 To accelerate the review process and guarantee the final decision in due time, the paper will be sent to the reviewers few days after the submission. For this reason, authors are warmly invited to upload just papers ready to be referred. The upload of the final version can be done after the review process is terminated.
- 4 You can check the list of papers for which you are author or co-author once you log-in to the **web-platform**.

EDOARDO MOLLICA AWARD



ASTRI Association, in collaboration with the Economic Evaluations and Real Estate Appraisals Lab, is honored to commemorate the figure and work of Edoardo Mollica – full Professor of Real Estate Appraisal and Valuation, pioneer in the research field of Inner Areas and open-eyed scholar of Metropolitan Cities.

The Award is aimed at encouraging the participation of young researchers in the scientific debate. The prize will be awarded to the most innovative and original papers written and presented exclusively by young scholars, in response to the Call For Papers NMP24.
